ABOUT HUDSON VALLEY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

THE GLOBAL CLASSROOM HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM

Through the Global Classroom High School Program, high school students can register to take college-level courses, for which they will receive college credit upon their successful completion. More detailed information about the program follows.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION AND ACCREDITATION

- The language of instruction for all courses is English.
- All online learning courses at the college are fully accredited and are taught by Hudson Valley Community College faculty.

COURSE MATERIALS

 All of the courses use free Open Educational Resources (OER), which will be available online. Therefore, students will not need to purchase or receive course materials!



THE COST

 To make certain that this opportunity is accessible to as many high school students as possible, during the summer of 2024, students can enroll in up to eight (8) credit hours, and automatically receive a full scholarship for the tuition! Students who enroll in more than eight (8) credit hours will be billed \$70 (USD) per additional credit hour and will receive a bill, which can then be paid securely online using Discover, MasterCard or Visa.

METHOD OF COURSE DELIVERY

 Instruction for these courses is delivered completely online, using the D2L Brightspace Learning Management System.

CONVENIENT INSTRUCTION

All of the courses in the Global Classroom High School Program are being taught asynchronously.

 This means that students can access all of the course materials, assignments, lectures and tests at any time, when it is convenient for them.

REQUIRED TECHNOLOGY TO COMPLETE COURSEWORK

 Students will need access to a computer with an internet connection that meets certain minimum requirements, which can be found in the "Required Technology" section of the following page: www.hvcc.edu/global-classroom-hs.

OPPORTUNITIES TO INTERACT WITH INSTRUCTORS

 All of the instructors will have virtual office hours, so that students can meet with them. If students are unavailable to meet with their instructors during their scheduled virtual office hours, instructors are available by appointment.

PATHWAY TO A DEGREE

- Credits can be applied to Hudson Valley Community College programs or transferred to most four-year colleges and universities in the United States.
- Humanities courses can be applied to many types of degrees, such as Education.
 Science courses can be applied to degrees in STEM, such as Engineering. Business courses can be applied to degrees such as Business Administration and Entrepreneurship. Health Sciences courses can be applied to degrees such as Nutrition and Nursing.

- Online courses appear on your Hudson Valley Community College transcript, in the same way as a traditional classroom course, with no difference.
- The summer session for the Global Classroom High School Program is July 1 August 9.

REGISTERING FOR CLASSES THROUGH VOYAGER

- Global Classroom High School Program students can view, request, and register for courses through the Voyager System.
- To apply for courses through the Global Classroom High School Program, you will need to create/log into an account on Voyager, even if you've previously taken classes through HVCC.
- Every completed application in Voyager is processed by HVCC in the order it was received upon approval by the school counselor/contact.
- Registration is not confirmed until the status shown under "My Class Application(s)" in Voyager is changed to "Registered".

- While the GCHP works to provide a robust number of course offerings, not all HVCC courses are available for Global Classroom High School Program students.

- Select "How to Register for Global Classroom High School Program Course(s)," to create your profile, sign the Student Agreement, view course offerings, and apply for classes.
- Once you've applied to your course(s), your school official will be asked to confirm and approve, at which point HVCC will register you for your class(es).
- HVCC works with high school officials to review and approve course requests.
 After the student fills out an application, the school official will need to complete the counselor review to approve course requests. Once approved, the request must be sent to HVCC to finalize registration.
- The deadline to complete the registration process for Summer 2024 is June 13.

GLOBAL CLASSROOM ID CARD

 The college will then issue each student a digital Hudson Valley Community College Global Classroom Identification Card.
